DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 1-1/2 story brick and frame building with a high basement just below the street level, and it is detached on the right side. It is three bays square and was built in three sections, all during the Federal period. The middle timbered section is the earliest of C1830, and it has a full width brick front section of about 6' in depth and a full width brick rear section of about one bay deep. All brickwork is of common bond. The original entranceway occupies the center bay with a simple four paneled door, a paneled enframingent, a four pane overlight, and thin wood lintel. This is now protected by a modern colonial crossbuck storm door and, together with a hanging basket of seasonal flowers, is quite attractive. This is approached by a seven step cement porch. On either side are enlarged windows of 1/1 sash and on the second story are three sets of 4+4 pane "bee brow" casement windows, and all have wood lintels and sills. Rear area windows are of either 6/6 or small pairs of 1/1 sash and the doors have glass over panels. The moderate slope "A" frame metal roof covers all three sections and has a small square chimney protruding from the rear center area. This roof is supported on the front by a two string brick cornice. There is a long lawn area to the rear.
