

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an early Federal brick mansion-sized building of very large proportions and is 2-1/2 stories in height, detached, eight bays wide and approximately four bays in depth and has various sized wings. From the front brick arches, it appears that #219 was designed as a four bay wide house and #221 & #223 as two bay wide houses. To the rear of #219 is a two story brick, full width wing, one bay deep and an extension of a two story brick wing, angled to the first wing to conform to property lines of this block. It is two bays wide and three bays long. This is widened to the right side by a full length two story brick and timber wing five bays long and one bay wide extending out from the right side of the building. #221 has a one story, one bay square frame extension. #223 has a two story brick wing one bay deep and two bays wide with an added two story brick, two bay wide and three bay deep extension at an angle. Both #219 and #223 have small end balconies. Front brick work is laid in Flemish bond and all others in common bond. The #219 entranceway occurs in the left bay of this section and formerly held a wide and high spacious doorway which is now reduced to a cement ramp and glass brick wall vestibule. The first floor windows and those on the second story for all three houses are of 1/1 sash with flat brick arches. #221 and #223 have entranceways in the second and third bays from the left with paneled doors and rectangular transoms. There are wide 2/2 sash windows on either side with segmental, two row header brick arches as over the doors. All rear area windows are a combination of various sized 6/6 and 1/1 sash. Remaining rear windows of the front section have flat brick arches and the wings have wood lintels and sills. The roof of the front section is of a high, moderate slope "A" frame with enclosed double chimneys on either side of the gable, joined by curtains and on both ends of the building. The pair on #219 still retain rounded brick caps. This roof is supported on both the front and rear by three string brick header cornices with that on the front being rather ornate with the top row convex and the bottom row concave . #219 is covered by asphalt shingles and the other two houses have  metal roofs. The attic of #219 is well lighted by a peaked 6/6 sash dormer on the front; a double window peaked dormer on the rear and a small window in the right gable. #223 has a 6/6 sash window in the left gable. There is a small chimney extending from the left end of the roof of #221. The wings have metal shed roofs with the one on #223 being very steep. The building has a rather high foundation (fieldstone). There are very long, neglected, rear yards.
