DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of houses, six bays wide and two bays deep with two story brick "U" shaped wings angled to the front section because of the property line pattern of this block. They are one bay wide, three bays deep on #220 and four bays deep on #222, and both have side balconies and one story, one bay square dependencies on the rear. All brickwork is of common bond. Entranceways are in the second bay from each end and consist of four paneled doors (only that of #222 remains), paneled enframements and three pane overlights. First floor front windows are of 1/1 sash and the second story and all rear windows have 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills with the second floor front having lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels as over the front doors. Rear doorways are quite low with glass over panels. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with the ridge off-center toward the front and with an enclosed chimney to the right of each house section (the left side, #220, being of four bays). The attic is lighted on each side by small four pane windows in the gables. The wings have shed roofs and all are of metal. The left side front section chimney of #220 has been removed. The rear of the front section has a three string brick cornice of the Federal period while the front has an overhanging Victorian cornice supported by closely spaced carved brackets with pendant decor and all on a wooden frieze. The building rests on a high fieldstone foundation. There is a low lawn area to the rear.

NOTE: The Brinkman 1969 survey treated this as two houses, but there is no seam in the front brickwork.
