DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two story brick pair of attached houses, four bays wide and two bays deep with two story brick "U" shaped wings 1-1/2 bays wide and two bays in depth with brick rear extensions of two bays with rear balconies and angled to the first wings to conform to lot lines of this block. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways occupy the end bays with small paned doors with round arched transoms. In between are double, round-arched, 1/1 sash windows with carved mullions. The four front windows of the second story are rather small with 1/1 sash and round heads. All front fenestrations have either two or three row brick header round arches. Rear area windows are either 1/1 or 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. Rear doors have glass over panels with rectangular transoms and #227 has a wood lintel with square end blocks, carved with roundels. The roofs of the front sections and wings are of metal and slope to the rear. The Victorian style front roof cornice is  shaped with bands of moulding, incised crosses, and pointed tooth designs. This is supported by three fluted brackets and a band of incised moulding, ending the brick frieze section. The building rests on a high foundation with five steps to the entrances. There are long, neglected gardens to the rear.
