DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two story, turn of the century, brick house detached on the right side and being three bays wide by three longer bays in depth. It has a lower "L" shaped, two story brick wing being two bays wide and four bays long with a side balcony and a new, one story brick and block extension which is two bays long and three bays wide extending to the left, over behind #247 and joining it. All brick-work is of common bond. The entranceway occupies the left bay with double paneled doors and a round arched transom. All front windows are of 1/1 sash with segmental brick, two row header arches with the top row forming hoods and with long center voussoirs forming "keystones." Rear area windows are of 2/2 sash with mostly flat brick arches and louvered shutters. A rear door has glass over panels with a one pane overlight. The front roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a low slope shed roof, both of metal. The front roofline has a Victorian shaped cornice with moulding and incised V's, and the bays are divided by carved brackets. On the brick frieze are incised rectangular wood panels and framed on the bottom by a band trimmed with dentils. The house rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation. There is a brick patio under the balcony and a side lawn area with shrubs.
