DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a small 2-1/2 story brick house located on a corner. It is three narrow bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, 1-1/2 bays wide and three bays long with a side balcony. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond, painted, and all other is in common bond with some walls being stuccoed. The entranceway occupies the right bay with an attractive reproduction of an old six panel door with brass hardware and with colonial lamps on either side. This is headed by a peaked wood lintel, probably a late addition. All windows are of 1/1 sash with moulded top wood lintels on the front and thin wood lintels on the rear. There are newer paneled doors on the rear. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof with a double flue enclosed chimney on the left and a small one on the right. A very prominent pediment projects to the front from the center ridge line and contains a round arched 1/1 sash window. This roof rests on a two string brick cornice--front and rear. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation. The interior has been attractively restored.
