DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached building with one half being a shop with apartments and #269 being a residence. It is six bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with a "T" shaped wing of brick and two stories, four bays wide, five bays long for #265-267, but only four bays long for #269. Both have long side balconies. #265-267 has a two story, three bay long frame addition and #269 has a one story, one bay square brick extension. #265 now has an ordinary shop entrance and large pane windows with #267 being the apartment entrance. #269 has an entranceway in the third bay from the left with a glass over panels door and a three pane overlight. This is approached by a two step cement porch with wrought iron railing. Front brickwork is laid in Flemish bond and has a moulded watertable. All other brickwork is in common bond. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with flat brick arches with the first floor of #269 having high brick jack arches. Rear windows are also 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and there are several four paneled doors. The attic is lighted by two small 4/4 sash on each gable. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with a wide enclosed chimney in the right gable and a smaller one on the left side. The wing has a steep metal "A" frame roof. The front roofline has a simple wooden boxed cornice. The building rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation.
