**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached house, three bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped 2-1/2 story brick wing, two bays wide and four bays deep with an enclosed side balcony and a newer two story brick, two bay square extension. All brickwork is in common bond with the front recently restored. The entranceway occupies the left bay with a six paneled door, 'panelled enframement, one pane overlight, and a moulded transom bar. Front windows are of 6/6 sash with louvered shutters and thin wood lintels and with end blocks carved with roundels as over the door. Side windows of the front section are of 2/2 sash and there are two old 6+6 sash wood casement windows on the rear, all with wood lintels and sills. Doors have glass over wood panels. The rear wing has 6/6 sash. The front attic is lighted by two small four pane sash windows in the end gables and on the wing by a small 6/6 sash window in the end. The front section and wing both have steep slope metal "A" frame roofs and there are enclosed chimneys (one narrow and one thick) on the end gables of the front section. The front roofline rests on a three string brick cornice. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation. To the rear is a rather simple garden with boxwood, shrubs, flowers, and a lawn area.
