DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses detached on the right side and being four bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped, two story brick wing approximately one bay wide and four bays long with a side balcony. This was once a 1-1/2 story building--per sidewall evidence. There is also a one story, one bay square frame addition on the right rear. All brickwork is of common bond. Front entranceways occupy the inner bays with #275 having the original with double front doors, now of glass panes, and with a vestibule. This inner entrance is of three part Federal design with a paneled door, sidelights, fluted pilasters, and a wide three part transom. This is approached by a time-worn sandstone sill and outer step. #273 has a newer, more narrow doorway with a six panel door, wooden sill and a one pane overlight. Front windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and decorated with low pediment moulded tops as over the doors. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with thin wood lintels and sills. Rear doors are of either four or six panels. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with enclosed chimneys on each gable, and it rests on two story brick cornices, front and rear. The attic is lighted by two-six pane sashes on the right gable. The wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. This building rests on a low fieldstone foundation. There is a wide rear yard with a lawn area, shrubs, flowers,----and reconstruction materials.
