DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a low 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses attached on either side and is four bays wide and two bays in depth. It has a two story brick "L" shaped wing behind #306 which is two bays wide and three bays long with a side balcony and a one story, one bay square rear dependency. The rear balcony of #304-1/2 has been enclosed. All brickwork is of common bond with the front recently restored. Entranceways occupy the inner bays with 304-1/2 having a six paneled door and #306 glass over panels and both with overlights. First floor front windows are 6/1 sash and the low second story has 4+4 "Beebrow" casement windows and all front fenestrations are headed by lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels. Rear windows are 6/6 with thin wood lintels. The doors have glass over panels. The attic of #306 is lighted by a small rear shed roof dormer window. The front section has a rather steep slope "A" frame roof with enclosed chimneys on either gable. This rests on a three string brick cornice at least on the front roofline, and is covered by metal on the front slope and asphalt shingles on the rear. The wing has a metal shed roof. The building sets on a low foundation.
