DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#213 is a 2-1/2 story brick home attached on the right (N) side and is three bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing four bays long and two bays wide with a side balcony. The front is laid in Flemish bond and all other is in common bond. A tall front entranceway occupies the left bay with a newer glass door, paneled enframement, white marble sill, and a moulded transom bar, all enclosed by paneled pilasters with grooved brackets supporting an overhanging flat entablature with dentil trim. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels, and they have louvered shutters. Rear area windows retain the 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The attic is lighted from the left gable by two 4/2 sash windows. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof, leveled midway on the front slope because of a raised front wall, apparently for more attic space -- unusual. This is now fronted by a Victorian "V" shaped cornice with bands of incised crosses, beading, scallops, and mouldings. A double flue enclosed chimney rises from each end wall. The wing has a steep slope shed roof and both are of metal. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
