DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick Colonial house detached on the left side. It is three bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with an "L" shaped 1-1/2 story brick wing being two bays square and with a newer extension. There is a small square enclosed balcony resting on extended second story rafters on the side opposite the wing. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond and a moulded brick watertable extends across the building. All other brickwork is in common bond. The entranceway occupies the right bay and has been altered considerably by a crossbuck door with diamond panes, a plain modern version of pilasters, a new peaked entablature, attractive lanterns on either side, and an occupant sign board. This does retain the three pane overlight and the paneled enframing, however. To the left are the two original windows, now with 1/1 sash, new narrow louvered shutters, and joined at the top with a wide peaked entablature, as over the doorway. On the second story are newer 1/1 sash windows with original shutters and flat brick arches. First floor arches are now hidden. On the rear and side are original 6/6 sash with others being 6/1 and 1/1 and with either flat brick arches or wood lintels and sills. There are no longer any rear doors. The attic is lighted by two-six pane windows in the left gable. There is a small 2/2 sash peaked dormer on the wing. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with wide enclosed chimneys, topped by deep bands of corbelling, on the gables. The wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. The front roofline is decorated by a nicely proportioned and moulded box cornice with another section of moulding running beneath it. This building rests on a low foundation. There is a long yard to the rear.
