DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall and large three story brick building detached except for a small frame fill-in building on the left side. It is three bays wide and approximately five bays deep with a rear third story balcony and a 2-1/2 story brick "L" shaped wing two bays wide and seven bays long with a side balcony. All brickwork is in common bond with the front being recently restored. The first floor front contains a nicely designed shop area with large paned windows over panels on either side of the double doors of similar proportions and with a large rectangular transom with a decorative transom bar with a floral motif    which is also used to decorate above the apartment entrance and all cor-
nices. To the left is the apartment entrance with double doors of three panels each with the center in glass and a rectangular transom bar with the floral motif. This leads to a large vestibule with double doors with panes and panels and a similar transom treatment. The whole first floor is unified by a deep projecting Victorian cornice with bands of large dentils, the floral motif, and quarter round dentils at the base. This cornice is supported at the sides of the doorway and storefront by carved brackets with another floral motif  on the bosses and vertical rows of small globes. Upper story front windows are tall and narrow with 1/1 sash and segmental brick arches. Those on the second floor have the lower sash twice as high as the upper sash. The front roofline has another Victorian cornice with bands of moulding, flower motifs  and an attached pendant design. This is supported by four moulded and fluted  brackets and the bottom of the brick frieze is emphasized by a moulded band. On the rear of the front section is 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The first floor rear has an old double pair of shop doors with panes over panels, a paneled enframing, and an old four pane overlight. There is also a 6/6 sash window with unusual shutters--double faced with vertical panels on the inside and diagonal panels   on the outside. There are star and "S" brace terminals on the side wall. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear. The wing has 2/2 lintels, louvered shutters, small 6/6 sash with paneled panel doors and the gable is lighted from the end by sash. The "A" frame roof is of metal with a steep slope. The building rests on a low foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is a well designed and attractive Victorian building in excellent condition. The first floor has a unified design and the Victorian decor is repeated on all sections of the front facade. Being of three tall stories and of a box shape, it does not blend with its neighbors but is one of the City's better examples of this period.
