## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a row of four houses, two stories in height, detached on the left side, and the building being eight bays wide and two bays in depth with the end houses having "L" shaped wings and the two center houses sharing a "T" shaped wing, each being 1-1/2 bays wide and six bays long with end balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Entranceways occupy the first, third, fifth, and seventh bays from the left and consist of four panel doors with paneled enframements, segmental arched transoms, and all enclosed by moulded architrave with a square peaked moulded ornament at the top center. The doors also have marble sills. These are approached by cement porches of up to six steps as the building rests on a very high fieldstone foundation. Enclosed entranceways lie between the first and second and third and fourth houses with yard gates at the rear to each house. These entranceways are headed by segmental brick arches. To the right of the doorways are double 1/1 sash windows with grooved mullions, flat brick arches of long voussoirs and decorated "shelf" lugsills. All front second story windows are also of 1/1 sash and topped by segmental brick arches. All rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. Rear doors have four panels, some now in glass, and have two horizontal pane overlights. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wings have slight slope shed roofs, all of metal. There are small enclosed chimneys at the ends of the wings. The front roofline has a Victorian cornice supported by fluted and incised brackets with bands of incised figures, floral motifs, and attached pointed pendants with spheres. There are neglected long yards to the rear.
