**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story frame house detached on the left side and approximately four bays wide and two bays in depth. It has a two story frame "L" shaped wing being two bays wide and approximately three bays long with a side balcony and a one bay extension and another one story frame, two bay square extension. The entrance-way occupies the left bay with a door containing a large oval pane surmounted by a segmental arched transom and moulded transom bar. To the right is a segmental arched double 1/1 sash window with a grooved mullion (common on this block) with a moulded capital. The first floor is fronted by a three step Victorian covered porch with balusters, turned pillars topped by carved brackets, and a band of pointed designs below the porch roofline. This roof extends to the right side of the building covering an enclosed carriage entrance with a board and batten gate and lattice screen top. Second story front windows are also of 1/1 sash with segmental arches. The front facade shows the work of a wood craftsman in its decor. The wood sheathing has vertical grooves representing stone blocks, building edges have protruding wood "quoins," and the boxed cornice has a frieze of moulded dentils. There are elaborately moulded brackets on each end. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash and 2/2 sash and some with louvered shutters. There are four panel doors with overlights. The attic is well lighted by a double 2/2 sash peaked dormer window on the front ar<sup>3</sup> by a four pane sash in the left gable. The front section has a moderate slope wood shingle "A" frame roof with no chimney and the wing has a metal shed roof with two enclosed chimneys. This house rests on a high fieldstone foundation.
