**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of houses being four bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped 2-1/2 story brick wing built at the same time and to the rear of #344. This is three bays long and 1-1/2 bays wide with a side balcony and a two story brick 1/2 bay extension. #342 has a one bay deep full width frame extension extending to the left of the building line by 1/2 bay and also has a rear one story, one bay square extension. All brickwork is in common bond. Front entrances occupy the inner bays with four panel doors, paneled enframements, and rectangular transoms. First floor windows are of 1/1 sash with unusual rectangular transoms. Second story front windows are of 6/6 sash with louvered shutters and all have wood lintels with square end blocks carved with four petal roses. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and doors have glass over panels. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with a two string brick cornice on the front and double flue chimneys rising from each gable. The attic is lighted by small 4/4 sash on each end. The wing to the rear of #344 also has a moderate slope "A" frame roof and both are covered by asphalt shingles. A three horizontal pane sash lights this attic from the rear. The building rests on a moderately high fieldstone foundation.
