DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick building containing three residences and is detached on the right. It is six bays wide and two bays deep with a two story full width brick wing being two bays deep and built at the same time. #351 and #353 share a two story, two bay deep, frame extension with end balconies. The first floor of #355 was formerly a butcher shop, so there were no extensions necessary. All brickwork is of common bond. Entranceways occupy the left bay of each section with #355 having a double glass set of doors (glass over panels). The other homes have four panel doors with top panels rounded. All have round arched transoms topped by three row header hoodmoulds with keystones of long brick voussoirs. All are approached by high porches with wrought iron railings. All front windows are of 1/1 sash. The first floor contains a narrow window for #355 and wide ones on #351 and #353, all with segmental arched transoms and decorative transom bars with fluted sections intersperced by roundels. All are crowned with high jack arches with protruding brick keystones as over the doorways. Second story windows are in sections of three, with wider and taller ones in the centers. These are all topped by round, three row brick header arches. Rear area windows are of regular and small 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills, and there are glass over panel doors. The front section has a steep "A" frame roof covered by asphalt shingles and the wing has a low slope "A" or pair of shed roofs. Small chimneys rise from the right side of each unit. The building is on a sloping street and has a very high fieldstone foundation with porches varying from five to nine steps. The front roofline has a narrow brick frieze with brick dentil trim. There are long lawn areas to the rear.
