## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses detached on the right side and being four bays wide by approximately three bays in depth. All brickwork is in common bond. #352 has a two story frame "L" shaped wing covered by siding, one bay wide and two bays in depth. #354 has a full width, two story brick wing three bays in depth and with a rear balcony. Front entranceways occupy the inner bays with glass over panels doors, paneled enframements and three pane overlights. Front windows on #352 are of 6/1 sash and #354 now has 1/1 sash but both have grooved lintels with plain end blocks as over the doors. Most rear area windows are  with 6/6 header with #352 having wood lintels and sills and #354 with two row brick segmental arches. #354 has a rear, four panel door with a one pane overlight. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof resting on three string brick cornices, front and rear, and a double flue enclosed chimney rises from each end. The attic of #354 was formerly lighted by a small 4/4 sash. #352 has a 6/6 sash peaked dormer on the rear. The wings have shed roofs and all are of metal. This building sets on a moderately high foundation of fieldstone.
