DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This apartment house replaced an earlier one story frame shop of no architectural value. While not a perfect reproduction, it was built with many Federal style features to give the appearance of an old Federal home, such as an unpainted Flemish bond front facade, a small paned bow window at street level, a six panel entrance door with overlight, a wide enclosed "carriage entrance" on the right, 8/8 sash second story front windows with jack arches, a three string belt course with the center string being in dentils just below the front roofline, attractive crossbuck colonial style storm doors, a brick pavement, and three peaked 6/6 sash frame dormers on the front of the "A" frame roof.
