**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a very large house of the Federal period formerly of 2-1/2 stories but later raised to three and Victorian trim added. It is detached, three bays wide and deep and has a three bay long, two story wing, two bays wide with a balcony running along the west side. The front section has a metal roof sloping to the rear and the wing has a moderate pitch "A" roof. Brickwork is of a rough cast common bond and has recently been sandblasted and painted.

The doorway occupies the east <sup>bay</sup> wing with two single pane glass doors with a rectangular transom and all fronting a vestibule. Front windows become smaller as they rise. They are 1/1 sash and all side and rear windows are 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front windows and doorway are capped by protruding wood cornices peaked in the center and with side drops containing medallions with five petal roses from the coat of arms of Martin Luther. The house has a low fieldstone foundation. The first floor front windows have decorative cast iron window box grills. The front roof cornice is supported by four brackets with a row of dentils and a concave section with small incised vertical divisions. The frieze is of wood. Cornice brackets are unusual with a pair of short pillars on each. The house has a twin chimney with curtains enclosed on the west side and it is understood from the pastor that a similar one was taken off the east side. The roof has sidewall curtains which are stepped down. A one bay, one story addition extends to the rear. Cantilevered on the west wall of the front section is a three s <sup>d</sup> bay window on the second floor level. It is attractively designed and the bottom extends down to a corbelled point. There are two string brick cornices on either side of the wing at the roofline.
