

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This brick building, a former carriage house for a millionaire, was later used as a garage and was more recently converted to a "Youth Lounge" and second floor clubroom for the Lutheran Church. It is to the rear of #35 E. Church Street. A two bay wing has been added on the south alley side during the above conversion and blends in very well. The alley side is three bays wide and the whole building is of 1-1/2 stories. The building is approximately five bays long with a peaked dormer on each end and three dormers on each side. the west dormers are single windows double. All have 6/6 sash and peaked string brick cornice runs all around string from the bottom is composed every other one protruding-very dec- building has a metal hipped roof. common bond.
