## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a very high detached, three story (basement has walk-in doors at street level), six bay wide duplex. It is also six bays in depth with a two story, five bay long, four bay wide "T" shaped wing. The front section has a metal flat roof sloping to the rear while the wing roof is of a very unusual shape. One fourth of the metal roof slopes to the west while the other section becomes a shed roof sloping to the east. The west side of the wing has a short balcony with the end built out to its edge by a modern facade. The east side has a two story gallery along the east wall. All brickwork is common bond.

The very high front doorways in the first and third bays from the west are recessed. The recessed doors are double paneled with rectangular overlights. The entrances are approached by brick porches with wrought iron railings. Three more steps reach the first floor level inside the recesses. The six segmental brick arched windows on each of the second and third floors have 2/2 sashes with wood sills. The four first floor windows are 1/1 with ornate wrought iron window box grills. Front basement windows are 2/2, also with segmental brick arches and basement doors are paneled. Basement walls are fieldstone faced with brick and the pavements are of hexagon bricks reportedly brought over from England as ship ballast in Colonial times. Side windows of the front section and wing are mixed 6/6, 4/4, and 2/2 sash with flat brick arched windows or wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters.

A massive, very fancy Victorian cornice fronts the roofline. It contains seven carved long brackets ending in points. A row of protruding carved modillions lie just beneath the top with the brackets extending from every fourth one. A carved band ties the bracket ends together. The frieze has raised wooden panels with incised designs between the brackets.
