## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached, duplex double house which is 2-1/2 stories high, four bays wide and the front section is two bays deep. It has a five bay long wing "T" shaped off the center which is four bays wide. The front section "A" frame metal roof is rather steep in front with an off-center gable. The wing roof is also metal and has a very gradual slope toward the ridge. Chimneys are enclosed in each end wall of the front section and have wooden cornices. A taller chimney in the center has a brick cornice. There are two chimneys on the end of the wing. The sides of the wing are rather unusual. There are balconies across the first three bays then the last two bays are built to the outer edge of the balconies which enclose both ends. There are also galleries across the back of the wing. The ridge of the wing is below the base of the front roofline. This probably means a few steps difference in the floor levels of the two sections. The front section is faced with a light salmon color common brick while the rest of the building is a darker color, also common bond. Doorways occupy the outer bays. They are four paneled with overlights. Side and rear doors also have overlights but top sections are glass paneled. All door and window cornices on the front are projecting wood moulded and segmentally arched in the center with roundels below the top (infills) center. Front windows are all vertical 2/2 sash with wood sills. All side windows are 6/6 sash and wood sills.

The rear of 214 has a first floor, fifteen (15) pane, newer window while 216 has a 4/4. The side gallery areas have segmental brick arches and shutters of the same shape. The rest of the side and rear windows have wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. Doorways in front are approached by brick porches with iron railings. The front and rear cornices are simple boxed. The fieldstone foundation is rather low and there are two segmental arched brick cellar windows on the front. A herring-bone pattern brick pavement fronts the property.
