DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story, three bay wide house built against the next house on the east. It is two bays deep with a four bay long, two bay wide wing along the east. The front roof is low pitched "A" frame with sidewalls built up to form stepped roof curtains and a chimney on the west end. The wing roof is very unusual in that it is a very steep shed roof down from the east wall. This causes windows on the west wall to be very low on the second floor. The roofing is metal. There is a chimney on the top end. An enclosed porch of one story is on the end of the wing. All brickwork is common bond. There is a three section doorway with a four paneled door, sidelights with paneling and a rectangular transom with sidelights. The door is separated from sidelights by narrow fluted pilasters, as is the transom. It is topped by a long wood lintel. Front windows are 1/1 with wood lintels and sills. Side windows are 6/6 with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. A balcony runs along the west wall and is enclosed by a 1/2 bay extension out to the edge of it. A two string brick cornice runs along the front roofline. The foundation is very low.
