DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story duplex row house with each section being two bays square. It is built in a "U" shape with narrow two bay square wings. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame metal roof with double chimneys enclosed in each end. The wings have metal shed roofs sloping toward each other and with chimneys in the ends. Each house has a peaked 1/1 sash dormer in the center of the front roof. All brick-work is unpainted common bond. The doorways occupy the outside bays and enclose double glass paneled doors with half round overlights and arches. The front windows are 1/1 sash with two row header brick round arches above them and the doorways. Windows have wood sills. The second floor front windows are more narrow than those below and the louvered shutters are shaped to fit the arches. The wing windows, arches and sills are the same as the front. Each wing has a balcony across the end. The front cornice is three string brick. The building has a very low fieldstone foundation with a herringbone pattern brick pavement. There is long grass and lower gardens to the rear.
