DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

A three story, three bay wide apartment house which has been raised from a 2-1/2 story house like those nearby, it has a four bay long, two bay wide wing along the west wall with a one bay square addition. This building is detached on the east side. The front section roof is metal and slopes to the rear. The metal roof on the wing and on the additions are shed types. There is one chimney in the front section east wall, enclosed, and one on the rear of the wing. The front door is entered by a vestibule with a glass and paneled door on the inside and storm door on the outside and is in the west bay. All windows are 1/1 sash on the front with single and double 1/1 sash windows on the east side of the front section. First and third floor front windows have wood sills with the second floor having brick sills. All front windows have segmental brick arches including the door. The arched areas below the brickwork are filled (infills) with raised triangular panels with roundels in the center. All side windows in the wing are 6/6 sash, have wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters (also found on first floor front). The house is faced with English bond* on the front, first and second floors, and common bond on the east, detached side and rear. All brickwork is painted. The cornice is an extremely simple boxed type. The ground level slopes to the rear giving a high foundation on the back. A Victorian covered porch has been added to the front.

*English bond debatable because of many layers of paint.
