**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is an unusually wide 2-1/2 story duplex detached structure with each house being three bays wide and three bays deep with wings in a "T" shape being five bays long and two bays wide. The front section has a rather steep sloping metal "A" frame roof and the wing has a low sloping metal "A" frame roof. There is a double enclosed chimney extending through the top west gable of each house. A one bay extension leads from the rear of 233. Even though these houses were built as one structure with a continuous front wall, they have many different features. 231 has two peaked dormers on the front roof with 6/6 sashes. The front doorways occupy the east bays. 231 has a simple wide entrance with two glass paneled doors leading to a vestibule and with a wide overlight. It is topped by a wood lintel. 233 has a more narrow doorway with a four paneled door with flat entablature and with carved receding dentils beneath. The front doorways are reached by two step porches with iron railings and pavements of brick herringbone design. 231 has 1/1 sash windows on the front with wood lintels, sills and louvered shutters. 233 has 2/2 windows upstairs with wood lintels and sills but 1/1 downstairs with protruding carved cornices and bracketed ends with wood sills. Louvered shutters are used for both floors. Wing windows for 231 are 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The doors have six panels and there is a JIB window to the exposed rear of the front section of 231. 233 has 2/2 windows with wood lintels and sills on the wing and the JIB window is in the first bay of the wing. Both houses have long balconies along the exposed sides of the wing. All brickwork is painted common bond. The structure has a low fieldstone foundation. A three string brick cornice runs along the front roofline.
