**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is an ornate row of three brick attached, three story houses, each two bays wide and approximately four bays in depth. #226 has a two story brick "L" shaped wing, three bays in depth and two small bays wide, angled to the front section. #228 & 230 share a three bay deep and narrow four bay wide "T" shaped brick wing of two stories for #228 and three stories for #230, and both are angled into the front section. All houses have rear balconies. All brickwork is in common bond and the top stories of the front facade on each house have superimposed brick panels holding sets of three windows in each story. All have brick panels in relief between 2nd and 3rd story windows, but #226 and #226 have different designs of corbelled out brick piers. Round arched front entranceways occupy the left (N) bay of each house and contain double doors of panels, white marble sills, and ornate transom bars decorated with bands of beading and scallops. To the right of these are wide round arched windows and upper story windows are in sets of three with the center one being wider and all having flat brick arches. All rear windows are of 2/2 sash with two row segmental arches. The front facade is topped by a slate mansard roof fronted by a protruding pediment in a different design for each house. The center pediment contains an extension of the front wall with a small oval window and topped by short pedestals with the center section convexly curved in to support a small central pediment. This is dentil trimmed, as are the cornices over the pedestals. The end houses have attached balustrades with the end pedestals supporting globes with a large half-round pediment at the center on #226 and a regular pediment on #230. The tympaniums are decorated by embossed foliated patterns in metal. A moulded cornice with dentil trim crosses the building at the base of the mansard roof. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wings have rather flat roofs. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation with high cellar walls of brick. A three string belt course crosses the building at the first floor level.
