DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a very large 2-1/2 story Federal house detached on the east side but with a 1/2 bay extension on the west side. It is three bays square and the newer side extension extends from bays past and overlapping the rear wall of the home and is of frame construction. Walls of the house itself are stuccoed over brick and painted white. It is built over a very high basement which is lighted by three vertical pane casement windows. There are large double chimneys with curtains enclosed in the gables of the rather steeply sloped "A" frame slate roof. The central doorway is of three part Federal design with a door of six panels, sidelights in a diamond design and panels beneath, separated from the door by narrow Doric pillars. The whole is surmounted by an elliptical arched fan light with radiating panes and ribbon design partitions around the edge. Above this is an elliptical arch of a stone pattern, possibly moulded in the stucco. The doorway is approached by a herringbone brick pavement, a massive double wrought iron gate set into brick pillars, and surrounded by a low brick wall with iron railings and a small front courtyard containing boxwood, yew, holly, azaleas, and sections of lawn.

The first floor level is reached by a wide wooden porch with eight steps and wooden railings. Colonial style lanterns hang on either side of the door. Over the doorway is a wide three part window with a 6/6 sash center section and 2/2 sidelight all with shutters. On either side and on the first floor are 6/6 sash windows with flat arches similar in design to the doorway and with wood sills. Side windows are 6/6 sash of various sizes. All windows have louvered shutters. The two second floor rear windows are the same three part design as over the front doorway. Below these are two 6/6 JIB windows, also of three part design and with sidelights. Panels in the JIB door and beneath the sidelights have rectangular recessions with ovals. A simple, three string brick cornice accents the front and back rooflines. A rear tree shaded garden is landscaped, and there is also an attractive sideyard to the east with a brick driveway and an entranceway of tall brick pillars, iron gates, and an archway with iron scrolls topped by a finial.
