DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story house, now containing two apartments, is actually the former wing of the corner house fronting on Record Street. According to the present owner, Mrs. Elizabeth Peters, it may have served as the original house before the Record Street house was built. It is detached on the west end and is six bays wide and approximately four bays in depth. A newer two story, two bay wide and one bay long wing has been added in an "L" shape to the west end. A long balcony runs along the rear north side and along the "L" extension. The front street side of the metal roof is shed type and the rear 2/3's of the roof is relatively flat with no visible evidence on the end wall explaining the raised section. An off-centered chimney is enclosed in the end wall.

The two central bays of the front facade are topped by a pediment. All brickwork is of common bond. A simple front door is off-center in the third bay from the east. It has four panels, an overlight, and a segmental brick arch. It is reached by five brownstone steps with iron railings. All front windows have 6/6 sash with those on the first floor having wood sills and segmental arches and louvered shutters curved at the top to fit. Second floor front windows have flat brick arches, wood sills and louvered shutters. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood sills and louvered shutters. Those on the first floor have segmental arches while those on the second floor have wood lintels and sills. The doors also have wood lintels but the newer wing has metal lintels and an old appearing section of three casement windows on the first floor with three panes each. The end of the building has a combination of newer windows. It is set on a high foundation with square basement windows along the street side with metal grills and segmental brick arches. Landscaping is noteworthy as the front of the building sets back from the street about one bay with a lawn and shrubs enclosed by a low brick wall and an old iron railing. To the rear is a brick patio with evergreens and potted plants.
