DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story duplex structure detached on the west side. It is four bays wide, approximately five bays in depth, and has a "T" shaped two story, three bays long, two bay wide wing. There is a divided balcony across the rear of the wing. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame slate roof with roof curtains and buttresses. Enclosed double chimneys on each side are connected by roof curtains. Two dormer windows with stepped-in gables and round arched 1/1 sash and 4/4 sash (rear) are mounted both on the front and back slopes of the roof. The wing has a low slope metal "A" frame roof. All brickwork is of unpainted common bond.

Recessed doorways occupy the first and third bays from the east and are round arched. The outer pair of doors are of long glass panels with wood panels beneath and with a half-round overlight. Inside entrances are of one wide door with glass over wood panels and overlights.

#122 has a granite porch slab with iron railing. #124 has a brick porch and a small portico with fluted Doric pillars supporting a round arched peaked roof decorated by dentils. On each side of the porch are decorative high backed wooden seats with a cut out curved design.

First floor windows are of wide round arched 1/1 sash with three course header arches with the same over the doorways. Second floor front windows are of 1/1 sash with two course header segmental arches. Rear and side windows are of 6/6 sash with two course header segmental arches, wood sills and louvered shutters. A three string brick cornice fronts the roofline. The building has a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone design brick pavement. A long flower garden extends to the rear.
