DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is of three and a half stories including the street level basement and the attic with a gable window. It is detached on the east side, is three bays wide and two bays deep, and has a low slope "A" frame metal roof. A large square chimney protrudes from the center of the ridge. A two story "L" shaped frame wing runs along the east wall and is three short bays long and one bay wide with a metal shed roof and wood and aluminum siding. A balcony runs along the west side of the wing. All brickwork is of common bond and painted.

A very high doorway rising up 2/3's of the front wall occupies the east bay. The outer door is of four panels with a rectangular overlight. It is framed by Doric pilasters and a large flat entablature. Inside the vestibule, six steps rise up to the inner door which is paneled with sidelights and an overlight. The doorway is approached by three sandstone steps. On the basement level is a low gateway to the rear, a low six paneled basement door leading to a former office and a small 6/3 sash window with paneled shutters, all with plain wood lintels. In the center of the first floor facade between the door and end wall is a three part window of 6/6 and 2/2 sash with mullions ornamented with fluting and roundels in the tops. The wood lintel is edged with moulding and has square blocks with roundels at the mullions and end. The second floor window just above and the first and second floor windows on the rear are of the same design. The 6/6 sash window over the door has the same lintel design. All first and second story windows have louvered shutters on the front. A three string brick cornice finishes the front and rear rooflines. A rear door courtyard is under construction. The low fieldstone foundation apparently only goes to the basement floor level.

This is a Federal style home built around 1840.
