DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a six bay wide, two bay deep duplex building, detached on the west side and is 2-1/2 stories high. A metal roof covers the low slope "A" frame as on the shed roof of the wing. A large chimney protrudes from the center of the ridgeline. An "L" shaped wing of two stories was added later to #129. It runs along the west wall of #129, is angled inward in the center to follow a later property line, is three bays long and one bay wide and has an east balcony on the side. All brickwork is of common bond.

Front doorways occupy the east and west bays. #129 has attractive double doors of three panels each and is approached by a cement porch with iron railings. This house has a double window of 1/1 sash with a fluted mullion centered in the other two bays. Above this is a three section bay window of 1/1 panes and ornamented with bracket cornice, dentils, and paneling at the bottom. Over the doorway is a single 1/1 sash window. The top 1/2 story has three low "bee brow" casement windows of four pane sashes. All front windows, except the bay and including the basement, have wood lintels with square end blocks and roundels. The rear of the house has two low "bee brow" 4 x 4 pane ("lie on your stomach") casement windows at the top and 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills below and on the wing. Glass paneled doors are used for the rear exits.

The front door of #131 is reached by a seven step porch and has glass over panels. On the basement level is a small six pane window and a board and batten door, half above the street level. First floor windows are of 2/2 sash, second floor of 6/6 sash, and the third floor has "bee brow" windows with six panes also on the rear. All have wood lintels with square end blocks and roundels. There is no wing on #131. Rear windows are 6/6 sash and there is an enclosed porch and balcony. A three string brick cornice supports the roof of the building on the front and rear. An attractive doorway garden lies to the rear of #129.
