DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two story, six row-house complex as part of a long row. Each house is two bays wide and the entire structure is two bays in depth. The three wings are two bays wide and four in depth and are attached in a series of "U" shapes allowing one bay for each house. The front section has a flat metal roof while the bays have slightly sloping metal "A" frame roofs. Double chimneys are enclosed in the end walls of the wings which are recessed one bay on the second floor to allow for porches which have now been enclosed. All brickwork is of common bond.

Front entrances are located in the first, fourth, fifth, eighth, ninth, and twelfth bays. Doorways in the fourth, fifth, eighth, and ninth bays are approached by double wood porch units topped by a peaked roof. All doorways are identical with a moulded wood framing around all sides with segmental tops. Entrance to the vestibules is by wood paneled doors with overlights. First floor windows are of 1/1 sash and double with fancy carved mullions and projecting wood moulded sills with decorative cutout edging below. Those have flat brick arches. The second floor front windows are of 2/2 sash, have wood sills, louvered shutters, and projecting Victorian wood design frieze. These windows are segmental arches with the tops of the shutters having the same shape. Rear windows have 6/6 sash, flat brick arches and either wood or brick sills with many louvered shutters. Paneled doors are on the rear and wings. A projected wood moulded box cornice fronts the building. It has small, closely spaced brackets with larger brackets extending down to designate each house. A wooden frieze edged in moulding lies beneath this cornice. Because of the slope of the street, the fieldstone foundation is very low at #132, but about four feet high down at #142.
