## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large pair of detached brick, 3-1/2 story townhouses, six bays wide and approximately four bays deep with a large, two story brick "T" shaped wing, six bays in depth and approximately four bays wide with rear galleries. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond and all other in common bond. The two wide Georgian shaped entranceways occupy the inner bays with modern, one panel doors with wood muntined sidelights over panels divided by attached, fluted, Doric pillars and there are long white marble sills. Above are elliptical, radiating fanlights with wood muntins and heavily moulded transom bars. A deep covered porch fronts the first floor with the roof supported by fluted columns and rectangular attached, fluted pilasters against the house. These are decorated by the capitals having egg and dart motifs and rosettes. Closely-spaced turned balustrades surround the porch and porch roof and the cornice is decorated with Metopes, Greek temple decor. This is approached by seven steps of concrete, marble and wood and there are beds of ivy on either side. All windows are of 6/6 sash with flat jack arches except for the second story front windows which are trimmed by round brick arches with white marble keystones and stuccoed infills above the flat headed windows. All front windows have white marble sills and louvered shutters. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame slate roof with the center sections of the sidewalls rising to imitate wide Georgian chimneys. The attics are well lighted by a pair of 6/6 sash dormer windows topped by pediments with returns on the front and rear of each house. The wing has a low slope roof with sidewall parapets. The front roofline and end sections of the rear roofline are contained by boxed cornices with funnel shaped modillions on the frieze. This building rests on a high foundation with the basement area mostly above ground level.
