

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 3-1/2 story brick pair of houses detached on the right (S) side. It is six bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a newer, two story brick "T" shaped wing, four bays wide and two bays in depth with rear balconies. The front facade has been faced or refaced with a dark red pressed brick and all is in common bond. Front entrances occupy the inner bays with an angled corner entrance on the right (S) side of #114. The original doorway is in the third bay from the left (E) side with a six panel door and rectangular transom with an opaque colored glass leaded window in a heraldic design. This is approached by a two step granite porch and leads to a large vestibule with wood paneled wainscoating, double doors with long oval panes set in panels decorated with raised scrollwork and with a rectangular transom bar of an attached turned banister design . There is also a tiled floor. Other entrances have newer, simpler door-ways. All front and side windows are now of 1/1 sash with very heavy wood lintels and sills and windows in the third bay from the left on each house are quite narrow. The first floor front windows of #114 have been altered and are now headed by a flat brick soldier course. Wide bay windows extend from the first and second bays from the left second story of each house and are trimmed by dentils and panels. Rear windows of the front section are large 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills. There is a newer, five sided first floor bay window on the rear of #114 and has small panes and dentil trim. #116 has a large leaded stained glass window on the rear. Large wing windows are of 6/6 and 2/2 sash with segmental brick jack arches. There are six panel doors. The attic is well lighted by a 6/4 pane round arched, peaked dormer window on the front and back of each house. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame slate roof with roof curtains and end buttresses. A pair of wide enclosed chimneys, joined by curtains, rise from each gable. The wing has a low slope metal "A" frame roof. Front and rear rooflines have simple boxed cornices. Low fieldstone foundation.
