**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a large house 3-1/2 stories in height, three bays square, with rear second and third story enclosed galleries. The main entranceway occupies the deeply recessed center bay of the second story with double doors of glass over panels with narrow sidelights and separated by fluted pilasters, and there is a paneled enframingent and high three part transom. This is approached by a double ended concrete porch of six steps and an additional flight of seven concrete steps up to the doorway. On either side of the porch on the first floor are old Federal shaped doorways with a door of glass over panels headed by stone (marble?) lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels. There are two sidelights on the left (N) door and only one on the right doorway. The central entranceway is protected by a Victorian cast iron marquee with glass panes and supported by chain brackets. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond brick and all other in common bond. There are star brace terminals on the front wall on either side of the entrance. All house windows are of 6/6 sash with the front having white stone (marble?) lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels and louvered shutters. The rear windows have wood lintels and sills. The attic is well lighted by two 9/6 sash, Gothic arched, stepped dormer windows on the front and two similar windows, but off center on the rear roof. The building has a moderate slope "A" frame roof edged by moulded boxed cornices on the front and rear with two chimneys rising in the right 11-- an old wide chimney with newer square chimney and there are roof curtains. The lei wall is corbelled in at the second story and front brickwork has been restored. If the first street level floor is considered a basement, it has a high foundation.

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### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This old Federal building blends well with other buildings of the same period on Court Square and is still attractive in spite of alterations.

According to an older former resident, this was built by Confederate General Bradley Tyler Johnson, later sold to a prominent local inventor, W. McClintock Young and still later was converted into an "Elks Club."

An early picture shows a first floor entrance with a Federal doorway headed by a flat entablature, leading to a central hallway. The basement floor was not used as shops as surmised by a former surveyor.
