DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a small, Federal picturesque detached pair of old brick, 1-1/2 story houses, four bays wide and two bays in depth. They share a lower 1-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing, two bays deep and three bays wide and a one story brick dependency extension. #237 also has a newer block rear extension and all brickwork is in common bond. Simple front entrances occupy the inner bays with four pane overlights and #235 retains an original four panel door. These are now entered by concrete stoops. The first floor window of #235 is of 6/6 sash on the front and 2/2 sash on the rear with wing windows of 6/6 sash. #237 now has 1/1 sash windows, front and rear. The top story is lighted by low "lie on your stomach" windows of 4+4 sliding casement windows on #235 and 1+1 sash on #237. All have wood sills and lintels and first floor front windows and doors are headed by moulded top lintels. #235 retains an old thin four panel kitchen door. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof resting on two string brick cornices and double flue enclosed chimneys rising from each gable. The wing also has a steep "A" frame roof with one remaining end window of four panes and all roofing is of metal. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
