DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#101 is now a three story brick townhouse detached on the right (E) corner side. It is three bays wide and two bays in depth with a rear section, originally a 2-1/2 story side wing of #103, (according to side wall evidence, later built up to three stories. This section is full width and three bays in depth. To the rear of this is a full width, three bay deep extension of three stories with built in rear galleries. The sidewall of the original wing is laid in Flemish bond through the second story and all other is in common bond. A classic front entranceway occupies the left (W) bay with double doors of small panes with a rectangular transom of leaded glass panes, a moulded transom bar, paneled enframingent, Victorian pilasters of squared fluting\* of Doric style and topped by a moulded pediment and frieze. This is approached by a wide sandstone colored concrete porch of eight steps with brass pipe railings. There is a large vestibule with another pair of small pane glass doors, leaded glass transom and narrow leaded glass sidelights. The floor is tiled with a marble band at the base of the walls. A brownstone band crosses the front and first two bays of the right sidewall, just below the window levels. A brick pier separates the first and second bays from the left and another pier braces the right side corner walls. Front windows are of 6/1 sash with shaped voussoirs forming the flat brick arches and they have brownstone sills. Right side windows of the front section are of small 6/6 of leaded and stained glass. On the sidewall of the "wing section" is a newer, three story, rectangular bay window, decorated with fluted Doric pilasters and panels. Other side windows are of 6/1 sash of mostly double windows with flat brick jack arches and brownstone sills. There are low pairs of double doors with glass over panels on this exposed right side. Roof sections are rather flat with sidewall parapets covered by tiles. There is a wide corbelled, partly enclosed chimney in the right sidewall of the "original wing." Crowning the right two bays of the front facade is a moulded pediment with a small leaded glass window surrounded by stick work trim and a low pent roof section, all in the tympanium. The front section is also headed by a moulded cornice with closely spaced, fluted modillions, wooden frieze with scrolled incised panels and continues around to the side. This building sets on a high foundation. The raised front lawn area is enhanced by evergreen foundation plantings, beds of ivy and seasonal flowers, all surrounded by a low cast iron fence and gate.
