DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large complex of buildings of various shapes and dates. The front section is a large, three story, detached building being five bays wide and six bays in depth on the right (N) side with three story rear galleries. The rear section of this is only two bays square and joined by a two story brick wing to the left, six bays long and two bays wide with a side balcony. The center section adjoins this and is of 1-1/2 stories, brick, eight bays long and two bays wide. A rear section adjoins this, being a newer, 2-1/2 story building fronting on the street to the rear. To the left of the front section is a three story brick side wing, two bays square and recessed by a bay. The front facades are faced with a small salmon colored pressed brick and all in common bond. The deeply recessed front entranceway occupies the center bay with Doric pilasters topped by a flat entablature. The recessed area has deeply recessed panels in the ceiling and sidewalls and there is a white marble floor, door sill and front porch with wrought iron railings. The large door is of four panels with narrow sidelights and has a three part transom with the mullions fronted by decorative moulded scrolls of carved acanthus leaves. Front windows become smaller as they rise and are of 6/6 sash, except for the first floor side wing with 6/9 sash and all have flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs and louvered shutters. The right side of the front section has 6/6 sash windows with brick segmental arches and most wing windows are either of 6/6 or small 4/4 sash with wood lintels and sills. There are several wide, three segmentally arched windows in the center section. In the first bay of the front section rear wing are simple, three part doorways with sidelights and overlights on the first and second stories. The front sections have gently sloping roofs, the front section rear wing - a shed roof and the long 1-1/2 story section has a slate covered steep slope "A" frame roof with small peaked 6/6 sash dormer windows. The sideyard to the left has lawn areas and seasonal flowers. The buildings rest on low fieldstone foundations and are fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. The front roofline is adorned by a broad overhanging moulded frieze with a band of large dentils.
