**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick pair of houses detached on the right (N) side and is five bays wide and three in depth and they share a 2-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing two bays deep and three bays wide with a side balcony on #241 which is enclosed by new construction on #239. Newer doors occupy the third and fifth bays from the left with narrow overlights. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with flat brick arches of long voussoirs and have louvered shutters. The left bay has an enclosed passageway to the rear yard with a gate decorated by turned banister over diagonal sheathing. The attics are lighted by a small, four pane window in the left gable and by a newer peaked 1/1 sash dormer window on the front of #241. The front section has a steep slope "A" frame roof resting on a two string brick cornice at least on the front with double flue enclosed chimneys rising from each side. The wing has a shed roof with a small end attic window and wide chimney. All brickwork is in common bond. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
