

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large brick apartment house five bays wide and four bays in depth, three stories high and detached on the left side. To the rear is a "U" shaped wing with the left section being three bays long consisting of a one story brick part with the two upper stories being frame. On the right side is a five bay long section mostly of brick, and both are two bays wide. All brickwork is of common bond.

The front doorway occupies the center bay with a modern, three part construction and modern type windows flank it on each side, but retain their brick segmental arches. A covered porch protects the first floor with Doric pillars and with a Victorian cornice consisting of a band of cutout design  There is a two story bay window in the left bay with cyma curved fluted brackets and a cornice similar to the porch. All upper story front windows are of 1/1 sash with flat brick arches. Rear area windows are also of 1/1 sash but with wood lintels and sills. The front section has a rather flat roof and the wings have shed roofs, both being of metal. The front roof cornice is very elaborate with bands of incised foliage, square floral bosses, pointed pendants and quadrefoils on the frieze. The front bays are accented by the moulded brackets. This building sets on a low foundation. It is fronted by a brick herringbone patterned sidewalk.
