DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story pair of brick houses detached, and approximately six bays wide and three bays in depth with a two story brick "T" shaped four bay square wing and a rear balcony. All brickwork is in common bond and the front facade is faced with a flat and long (Roman style) white pressed brick with the joint being at 1/3 brick lengths. A concrete band crosses above the first floor fenestration level. Front entranceways occupy the inner bays with very simple framing and #13 probably has an original door with Victorian-shaped panels. These are topped by plain rectangular transoms. On either side are wide 1/1 sash windows with concrete lintels and sills and above these are wide 1/1 sash bay windows with fluted pilasters, square moulded panels and dentil trim. In between are two small round arched 1/1 sash windows with two row header arches, cement keystones and impost blocks. A protruding cornice crosses between the tops of the bay windows with the same panel and dentil decor. On the third story level are brick pediments with stone coping and containing two 1/1 sash windows which rise above the bay windows on either end. These project from a slate covered mansard roof which is capped by a moulded cornice. Rear area windows are of 1/1 sash with mostly two row header brick segmental arches and louvered or paneled shutters. The front roof slopes to the rear from the mansard to the rear mansard section which is also of slate covering and contains two peaked 1/1 sash dormer windows for each house. There are small chimneys enclosed in each sidewall. The wing has a low slope "A" frame metal roof. The building rests on a rather high foundation and is fronted by a brick herringbone patterned pavement. There are long lawn areas with shrubs to the rear.
