DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#17 E. Second Street is an "L" shaped, three story, flat roofed, common bond brick house which faces south on East Second Street. It is a residential building and is an unrelated, semi-detached house.

The principal facade is three bays in width and three bays in depth. The main entrance door occupies the first bay from the southeast corner and is a door recessed with single vertical glass panels with small decorated wood panel below the glass. It has semi-circular transom with decorative wood sill and white marble door step. All windows are double hung, 1/1 sash with semi or round circular arch with keystone and rough faced. The second and third story windows have brick segmental arches. The cornice is bracketed with decorated frieze. There are two exposed cellar windows with belt line running above them the width of the house. There are also belt lines running under the second and third story windows.

The main entrance door is fronted by a three step brick stoop with a plain iron railing. There is a long yard at the rear of the house which was built about 1880. *- Rose Sargent*

The doorway has three row header brick arch with drip moulding and decorated b a brownstone key block and impost blocks as over the first floor windows.

The wing is of brick, two stories and "L" shaped being two bays wide and six bays long with a side balcony. Rear area windows are of 2/2 and 6/6, all with two row header segmental arches. Rear doors are of four panels with three pane overlight.

The front roofline is decorated by a Victorian cornice with finely cut incisions and the wooden frieze is decorated by bands of scallops, lozenges and spheres.

Front paving is of brick in a herringbone pattern.
