**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a tall, three story brick attached house approximately three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing seven bays long and two bays wide with a long side balcony and a one bay square newer extension. All brickwork is of common bond and recently restored. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with a three part enclosure consisting of a four panel door, narrow overlights over panels and separated by plain pilasters, a paneled enframing, wide two pane transom with a dentiled transom bar and topped by a flat brick arch of long shaped voussoirs as are all front windows. These windows are of Victorian multi-paned sash as seen elsewhere on this street and they became shorter for each upper story. Those on the first floor are protected by wrought iron box grills. The entrance is approached by a wooden stoop. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and have louvered shutters. The front roof slopes to the rear with high sidewall parapets and enclosed chimneys. Wing roofing is shed type and both are of metal. The front roof cornice is supported by closely spaced moulded brackets decorated by spheres and resting on a raised brick frieze. The house rests on a low foundation. Front paving is in herringbone design brickwork. To the rear are spacious gardens with tall trees, a brick patio and swimming pool.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

This late Federal or early Victorian townhouse may have had the third story added at a later date as the shaped bricks of the window arches and design of the wing are of the middle of the 19th century. This house is well maintained and blends well with its Federal neighbors.
