DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall, three story brick building containing two houses detached on the left alley side. It is six bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a "T" shaped, two story brick, four bay square wing. All brickwork is in painted common bond. Front entranceways occupy the end bays with double doors of panels decorated by Victorian trim. These are headed by round arched transoms with transom bars decorated by a broad rope design and having three row header brick arches with a drip mould, as are all front windows on the first and second stories. The two front first story windows are of one wide sash with round arched transoms and broad transom bars with the rope design. A three string corbelled belt course connects all first floor door and window arches. Front second story windows are of 1/1 sash with round arches and connected by a three string belt course with dentil trim at the arches and extending across the building below the sills. Third story front windows are of 1/1 sash, flat arched and protected by the protruding front moulded roof cornice. This is supported by long, closely spaced modillions and crosses just above the windows. Double, flat arched 1/1 sash windows with moulded mullions light the first bay of the left side on the second and third stories. All other side and rear windows are of 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills and are protected by louvered shutters. The front roof section rises with a slate mansard decorated by a wide band of fishscale shingles and then slopes to the rear. The wing has a low slope "A" frame roof and both are of metal. The building sets on a rather high fieldstone foundation. Front entrances are reached by marble sills and three step concrete porches with wrought iron railings.
