DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an "L" shaped, two story, "A" roofed running bond brick house. It faces south on E. Second Street. It is a residential building and is detached. The principal facade is three bays wide. The main entrance is in the first bay in the southwest corner. It has a single, four paneled door, moulded embrasure with recessed light mullion. The two windows are 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills, with solid shutters on the first story. There are three windows of 6/6 sash with louvered shutters on the second story. There is a three string brick cornice. There are two exposed cellar windows. The main entrance door is fronted by a brick stoop with hexagon brick on the first step with a simple iron railing. A fire company plaque is placed above the door.

On the west end of the main block, there is one window on the first floor; one window on the second floor, 6/6 sash. There are two other small shuttered windows spaced irregularly. The exposed west end of the house has the west wall of the smokehouse flush to its northwest corner, creating a solid brick wall.

The east side is 2-1/2 stories with an "A" frame tin roof. There are two small 2/2 attic windows with wooden lintels and sills. One 6/6 sash shuttered window is in the second story. The "L" is five bays wide with an open galley on the second story. The doors are in the first and third bay with 6/6 windows in the second and fifth bay. Ground level doors and windows open on to a picturesque patio. There is a lovely formal yard.

This house was built about 1820.
