DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story brick house detached on the right side. It is six bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story, brick "L" shaped wing, three bays wide and five bays in depth with a side gallery and a two bay long, one bay wide, two story extension. All brickwork is of common bond. The front facade is very asymetric with fenestrations placed independently of each other. The main entranceway is off center with double doors of panels and a segmental arched transom with a moulded transom bar. This leads to a wide vestibule with double doors of panels, segmental arched panes and a large rectangular transom. It is approached by a brownstone porch with a wrought iron railing. To the left is a triple, segmentally arched window with moulded mullions. All front windows are of 1/1 sash. To the right are two tall single windows. In the left bay of the second story is a double round arched window with a moulded mullion and on the right are three narrow, round arched windows. Those on the second story are shorter than those on the first. On the third story, a brick pediment rises off center above the doorway with a 2/2 sash large round arched window. This pediment fronts a slate covered mansard roof with shallow dormer windows with Victorian sash. The mansard is divided by a boxed, moulded cornice at the third floor level. All front windows have brick hood moulds with dropped sides. There is an enclosed passageway on the right side with a four panel door and topped by a cut wooden grill. On the rear area are tall 2/2 sash windows with louvered shutters and flat brick arches on the first floor with wood lintels and sills on the second. On the rear of the front section are single and double windows with segmental arches. There are rear doors with four panels. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof. There is a dentil trim at the front roofline and a two string brick cornice on the rear. The building rests on a high foundation. The front brickwork has been restored.
