**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This pair of houses is now three stories at the front facade, is of brick and detached on the right side. It is four bays wide and two bays in depth with a full-width, two story brick wing approximately three bays in depth and a one bay deep frame extension with rear balconies. Front entranceways occupy the first and third bays from the left and contain four panel doors, paneled enframements, four pane overlights, and are headed by flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs, as are all front windows on the first and second floors. Third floor windows are smaller. All windows except in the frame extension are of 6/6 sash with wood sills and lintels in the rear area. The front section has a steep slope shed roof from the front roofline to the rear and stepped sidewalls. The wing has a very low slope roof to the right side and both are of metal. The front roofline is boxed and supported by closely spaced brackets with cyma curved carvings and turned pendants. The front doorways are approached by three step brick porches with wrought iron railings. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a herringbone pattern brick pavement.
