DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#111 is a Victorian, 2-1/2 story, hipped roof house of native limestone that faces South of Second Street. It is a residential building that has been altered slightly.

The principal facade is five bays wide. The main entrance is centrally located and has a double door with single, beveled, oval glass panels with transom above. Occupying the first bay in the S/W corner is a large single sash double hung window with upper sash of leaded glass with cement sill and lintel. There is a semi-circular tower which forms bay windows on the first and second stories in the second and third bay. It has two single sash double hung windows with cement sills and lintels. Another entrance door in the fifth bay leads to an apartment upstairs. On the second story there are three windows similar to the first story. Directly above the main entrance, there is a recessed oval tiffany window decorated by four quins. The hip roof with deck is slate with a three window goblet on each side of the house. The tower roof is conical. The eaves overhang has scroll decorations against barge board trim. At the west end there are outside stacked chimneys. The house is built on stone foundation. There is a large open porch on the front of the house, first story, fronted by seven cement steps with stone and cement stoop. There are four exposed semi-circular cellar windows with keystone and quoin decoration. There is a lion head decoration above each window.

The east end exposure is eight bays wide. Windows are all double hung, single sash with cement sills and lintels, except for the enclosed entrance portion which has one large stained glass tiffany window and one large twenty-four pane window. There is an entrance door in the fourth bay and five exposed cellar windows. There are open porches on the north end. It has a large, lovely yard with garage with chimney.
